Here is an update regarding Summer 2021 research information for those working on campus. **The following information pertains to activities taking place after Commencement (beginning June 13).** A broader communication about campus expectations this summer is coming soon from the Core Committee. Information in that communication will supersede the "Expectations on Campus" information that I communicated on May 7.

## Summer Student Healthcare

- SHAC is closed for clinical services during the summer months, as is typical during academic breaks.
- All students need to submit proof of vaccination status in order to live/work at Carleton during the summer. Details for submitting this information will be conveyed by June 11.
- No daily symptom tracking. Given the low risk of COVID infection and spread among vaccinated populations, students do not need to complete the daily symptom tracker. If a student experiences symptoms of an illness, they should utilize local healthcare resources. Resource information will be provided at a later date.
- No need for quarantine. In accordance with CDC guidelines, if a student is vaccinated and exposed to someone with COVID, they are exempt from quarantine. Additionally, there will be no contact tracing services available on campus due to the exemption from quarantine guidelines.
- Symptomatic students do not need isolation. Symptomatic students should not work in the presence of others. If a student is experiencing symptoms of illness, they **should seek** healthcare from a local Northfield resource. That care may involve COVID testing, which is also widely available in the community. (One test is sufficient to determine or rule out COVID in vaccinated students.) If they test negative, a symptomatic student does not need to move to special isolation housing. They can simply self-monitor, seek healthcare as appropriate, and limit contact with others until their symptoms improve.
- COVID-positive students living on campus will be moved to isolation housing. Off-campus students will isolate in their current housing. Students should utilize local healthcare for any medical concerns they have during their isolation period. Details for reporting a positive case will be conveyed by June 11.

## Instrument Shop and Makerspace
