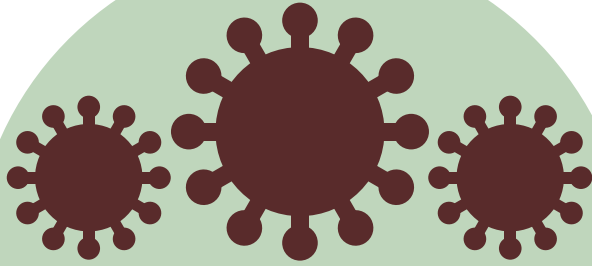

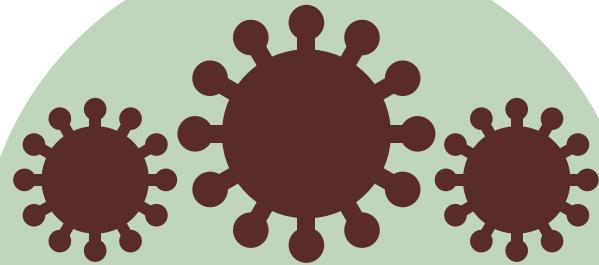

The Delta Variant: What to Know

- The delta variant is more contagious than the original strain
- The delta variant may be more severe than the original strain if you are unvaccinated
- Unvaccinated people are at the greatest risk for catching the variant
- Fully vaccinated individuals are less likely to get Covid-19
- Fully vaccinated people with breakthrough infections can still spread the variant, but appear to be contagious for a much shorter amount of time

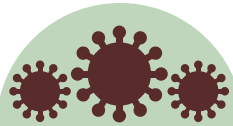

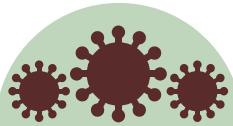

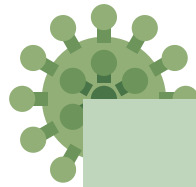
