

Conflict of Interest Bylaw

Section 3: Voting Procedure

Senate shall follow a written Conflict of Interest policy and shall publish that policy on its website. Senate may update the policy at any time with a two-thirds vote.

1. A conflict of interest occurs when there is a conflict between a Senator's private interest and public responsibilities.
2. Senators must abstain on votes for activities with a limited number of spots, for which they plan to apply. Senators must abstain from votes that would give them direct and exclusive monetary benefit.
3. Senators can vote on anything else so long as it does not violate the above.
4. The President will initiate a conversation with anyone accused of or admitting to violating the Conflict of Interest bylaw and discuss possible consequences including but not limited to impeachment.
