Immigration Corner

Traveling internationally during the break?

The U.S. government implemented new requirements on 11/8/2021 which will require you to show **proof of full vaccination along with your negative COVID-19 test** taken within the 72 hours before you arrive to the U.S. If you have recently had COVID-19, you can provide a letter stating that you have recovered from COVID-19 (along with your vaccination records). If you have not had a COVID-19 vaccine, you will need to receive a negative result within 24 hours BEFORE your flight to the U.S.

As always, you'll want to be sure that you have a **valid travel signature on your I-20 or DS-2019**. If you need an updated signature or have travel questions, please email <u>ecody@carleton.edu</u>.

Thinking about working off-campus?

CPT is the best option for paid/unpaid externships while you're a student at Carleton. You can find details about CPT including the application form **here.**

Fun Fact: Did you know that if you work an unpaid internship with Career Center funding, it's considered on-campus employment and does not require CPT?


