



Nancy Wilkie is a distinguished archaeologist and professor who has lectured to acclaim on numerous educational tours and cruises throughout the Mediterranean. She is

William H. Laird Professor of Classics, Anthropology, and the Liberal Arts, Emerita, at Carleton College, where she was co-coordinator of the Archaeology Concentration. From 1998-2002 she served as President of the Archaeological Institute of America (AIA), a co-sponsor of this program for whose travelers Nancy will also serve as representative. In 2009-10 she was the AIA's Charles Eliot Norton lecturer, one of the highest honors that the Institute bestows. Nancy has worked on archaeological projects in Greece, Egypt, and Nepal, authored more than 30 articles, and co-edited three books on archaeology. In April 2003 the President appointed Nancy to the Cultural Property Advisory Committee of the U.S. State Department, on which she continues to serve. In April 2013 she was elected President of the U.S. Committee of the Blue Shield, an organization dedicated to the protection of cultural property in times of armed conflict.

ake an unforgettable journey between two gems of art history: Venice and Athens. In Urbino, discover the great masterpieces of the Renaissance, then visit Diocletian's massive mausoleum in Split, Croatia, before cruising through the natural wonder of Kotor Bay to the classical ruins of Butrint in Albania. See ancient Olympia, birthplace of the Olympics, then spend a relaxing evening ashore in the historic port of Pylos. Tour Monemvasia,

the "Gibraltar of the Aegean," a tiny municipality joined to the mainland by a single causeway. Stroll around the car-less idyll of Hydra, one of Greece's most charming and picturesque islands, then arrive in Athens for a two-night hotel stay, giving you plenty of time to see the capital's magnificent classical treasures including, of course, the Acropolis.



## **ITINERARY**

Wednesday, September 18, 2019: Depart home Depart home on independent flights to Venice.

Thursday, September 19: Arrive Venice, ITALY

Arrive at Venice International Airport Marco Polo (VCE) and transfer to the Aegean Odyssey. Overnight aboard the Aegean Odyssey for ten nights. (L,D)

Friday, September 20: AM Venice walking tour or Lagoon excursion | PM at leisure AM guided walking tour of the city, a UNESCO World Heritage site. First, travel by boat down the beautiful Giudecca Canal to St. Mark's Square (Piazza San Marco). Walk to St. Mark's Basilica, and view (from the outside) the Doge's Palace, a 14th-century Gothic masterpiece. Alternatively, you may choose a morning boat excursion to two islands of the Venetian Lagoon: Murano, of glass-making fame; and Burano, with its gaily-painted fishermen's houses. After lunch aboard ship, the PM is at leisure in Venice. Dinner is aboard ship this evening. (B,L,D)

Saturday, September 21: Urbino: AM walking tour | PM at leisure

Urbino is a small town with a big history, and is today a UNESCO World Heritage site. AM tour of the 15<sup>th</sup>/16<sup>th</sup>-century artist Raphael's childhood home and then visit the Palazzo Ducale, Italy's most beautiful Renaissance palace. Continue on to the neoclassical Duomo (Cathedral), which was rebuilt in the early 19<sup>th</sup> century and houses several important artworks. The basilica's Museo Diocesano Albani has a collection of glass, ceramics, and religious items. Lunch and PM at leisure in Urbino. Return to the ship for dinner. (B,D)

Sunday, September 22: AM Split, CROATIA: Diocletian's Palace | PM at leisure or optional Salona & Trogir excursion

AM tour of Roman Emperor Diocletian's Palace in Split. Today a UNESCO World Heritage site, the palace complex is a vibrant warren of museums, shops, and restaurants alongside medieval fortifications, pre-Romanesque churches, and Gothic chapels. PM at leisure in Split OR you may take an optional excursion (*at an additional cost*) to two gems of the Dalmatian coast: ancient Salona, where archaeologists have excavated temples, a necropolis, an amphitheater, and baths dating from the 1<sup>st</sup> century A.D.; and the delightful nearby island of Trogir, a UNESCO World Heritage site lined with architectural jewels. Return to the ship for dinner. (B,L,D)

Monday, September 23: AM Korcula walking tour | Cruise past Hvar & Brac | Dubrovnik AM walk from our ship to Old Town to visit the impressive Cathedral of St. Mark, 14<sup>th</sup>-century Bishop's Palace, and 16<sup>th</sup>-century Gabrielli Palace whose City Museum displays Greek and

Roman artifacts. Korcula lays claim to being the birthplace of Marco Polo in 1254, and our walk takes us by his family home. PM cruising past the scenic islands of Hvar and Brac en route to Dubrovnik. Evening at leisure in Dubrovnik. (B,L,D)

# Tuesday, September 24: AM Dubrovnik walking tour | PM cruising Kotor Bay

AM walking tour of the Old Town of Dubrovnik, the best-preserved medieval walled city in the Mediterranean and a UNESCO World Heritage site. Visit the Dominican and Franciscan monasteries and the Cathedral of Our Lady, and pass such landmarks as the Sponza Palace, Baroque Church of St. Blaise, and Onofriou's Fountain. Return to the ship in time for lunch. PM cruising scenic Kotor Bay. (B,L,D)

#### Wednesday, September 25: Sarande, ALBANIA | Butrint

Take a 45-minute drive from Sarande to the UNESCO World Heritage site of Butrint (ancient Buthrotum), not only one of Albania's most remarkable archaeological sites but also one of its most

beautiful national parks. The approximately 50-square-mile site was occupied successively by a 6th-century Greek colony, a Roman city, and a bishopric. The city prospered under Byzantine administration, was occupied in the 14th century by the Venetians, then by the French, and then by the Ottomans, and was abandoned in the late Middle Ages. Walk along the winding paths to discover its monuments, get a great view from the acropolis, and visit the site museum. (B,L,D)

#### Thursday, September 26: Katakolon | AM Olympia tour | PM cruising | Pylos

AM drive from Katakolon to ancient Olympia, a UNESCO World Heritage site. See the ruins of the enormous Temple of Zeus, the Temple of Hera, the Prytaneion, and the famous stadium, and visit the site museum. PM cruising to Pylos, where the evening is at leisure. (B,L,D)

## Friday, September 27: AM Ancient Messene & Mavromati OR Neo Kastro & Methoni | PM at leisure

AM choice of two excursions (included), either to ancient Messene or the castles of Neo Kastro and Methoni. Those who choose well-preserved Messene, which dates back to 146 B.C., will see its theater, 3<sup>rd</sup>-century temple, sanctuary, and Byzantine monastery. Then drive a short distance to Mavromati village for a coffee break and panoramic view of Messene. Those who choose instead to visit nearby castles will drive to the 16<sup>th</sup>-century Neo Kastro ("New Castle"), which houses an archaeological museum and is one of the best-preserved castles in Greece; and to the vast, 13<sup>th</sup>-century Venetian castle of Methoni. PM at leisure. Dinner is aboard ship this evening. (B,L,D)

#### Saturday, September 28: AM Monemvasia walking tour | PM cruising | Hydra

AM walking tour of the lower town of medieval Monemvasia, along narrow, cobbled streets, and visit the 13<sup>th</sup>-century Church of Christos Elkomenos (Christ Chained to the Cross). Those who are up to the challenge can climb to see another 13<sup>th</sup>-century treasure, the ethereal Agia Sofia, with views over the sea and lower town. PM cruising to the charming island of Hydra, where the evening is at leisure. (B,L,D)

## Sunday, September 29: Disembarkation\* | AM Athens: Acropolis & Acropolis Museum | PM at leisure

Disembark in Piraeus and drive into Athens for an AM visit to the Acropolis (a UNESCO World Heritage site) and nearby Acropolis Museum. Ascend the Acropolis's rocky hill dominated by the majestic Parthenon, surrounded by other architectural masterpieces such as the Erechtheion, with its beautiful Karyatid Porch; and the Temple of Athena Nike (Winged Victory). A short walk down the street brings you to the excellent Acropolis Museum for a guided tour. Lunch and the balance of the day are at leisure in Athens. *Overnight at the 4-star King George Hotel for two nights.* (B) \*Nancy Wilkie does not disembark with the group, but continues her voyage on the *Aegean Odyssey*.

# Monday, September 30: Athens: Day at leisure OR optional AM National Archaeological Museum visit

Full day at leisure in Athens. Those who prefer may choose to join an optional AM excursion (*at an additional cost*) to the National Archaeological Museum, and then have the PM at leisure in Athens. (B)

#### Tuesday, October 1: Fly home

Transfer this morning to Athens International Airport (ATH) for independent flights homeward. (B)



Participants booking flights and transfers on their own will receive a \$1,000 credit, per person, to be applied on the final invoice. All government and airline fees and taxes are included. A confirmed flight itinerary can be provided within 60 days of deposit for most departures. Some non-standard gateways may incur additional charges. Airline-imposed personal charges such as baggage fees may apply. The air itinerary is subject to change and is not considered final until VTA has issued the airline ticket. #### Suite, Stateroom & Cabin Descriptions

All suites, staterooms, and cabins have a bath and/or shower, flatscreen TV, safe, hair dryer, and are fully air-conditioned. Balcony Class staterooms (categories A to D) have additional amenities as detailed on the next page. The sizes, layouts, and bed configurations will vary within a category.

The areas indicated are averages and include the balcony. Beds may be fixed double (queen size), fixed separate twin beds, or twin beds that can be converted into double beds. All outside staterooms/cabins have windows except Category J, most of which have portholes. Single cabin features include European full size beds – cabin sizes are smaller than sizes noted for double occupancy cabins.

**Category A:** *Owner's Suites:* 550 sq ft staterooms located on Lido Deck. Marble bathrooms, dressing area, separate sitting area, and private balcony. Convertible twin beds.

**Category B:** *Junior Balcony Suites*: 310 sq ft staterooms located on Lido Deck. Marble bathrooms, walk-in closet, sitting area, and private balcony. Convertible twin beds.

Category C/D: *Deluxe Balcony Staterooms:* 250-275 sq ft staterooms located on Lido, Bridge, and Belvedere Decks. Bath/shower or walk-in shower, sitting area, and private balcony. Fixed double bed, separate twins, or convertible twins depending on cabin selected. Cabins 807 and 808 on Lido Deck are smaller and do not have a sitting area.

**Category E:** *Deluxe Staterooms:* 215 sq ft staterooms located on Belvedere Deck. Private bath/shower or walk-in shower. Convertible twin beds. Cabins 556 and 563 are smaller but have a fixed double bed and a balcony.

**Category F:** *Deluxe Staterooms:* 170-200 sq ft staterooms located on Lido, Bridge, and Belvedere Decks. Bath/shower or walk-in shower. Convertible twin or fixed double beds.

**Category G:** *Premium Outside Cabins:* 130-150 sq ft staterooms located on Bridge and Lido Decks. Private shower, fixed twin beds, convertible twin beds, or fixed double bed. Views in some cabins are partially obstructed by lifeboats.

**Category H:** *Premium Outside Cabins:* 130 sq ft cabins located on Belvedere and Columbus Decks. Fixed twin beds with private shower.

**Category I:** *Premium Outside Cabins:* 130 sq ft cabins on Bridge Deck have two windows with views partially obstructed by lifeboats and some cabins feature a fixed double bed.

**Category J:** *Standard Outside Cabins:* 130 sq ft cabins located on Columbus Deck. Fixed twin beds with private shower. These cabins are similar in size and layout to Category I, but most have portholes in place of windows.

**Category K/L:** *Premium Inside Cabins:* 130 sq ft cabins located on Belvedere and Columbus Decks. Fixed twin beds with private shower.

**Category M:** *Standard Inside Cabins:* 130 sq ft cabins located on Belvedere and Columbus Decks. Fixed twin beds with private shower.

#### What to Expect

This unique program will be aboard the 216-cabin Aegean Odyssey for 10 nights plus two nights in a 4-star hotel in Athens. Daily excursions feature extensive sightseeing and require a certain level of fitness and mobility. A minimum expected level of fitness would be the ability to walk one to two miles within a period of two to three hours; ascend and/or descend multiple flights of stairs without assistance; and walk easily and comfortably along uneven, slightly hilly, and/or unstable surfaces. Also, some ports on the cruise itinerary may require transport to/from land via the ship's or local tenders, so you must be able to step down 1' or 2' into or out of boats, or onto floating platforms or piers. All participants are expected to be physically active and not be an impediment to others on excursions, to enjoy traveling as part of a group, and to be ready to experience cultural differences. Anyone who is not able to walk unassisted for extended periods is kindly advised not to join. If you have any questions about your ability to participate, we suggest that you visit your personal physician with this brochure in hand, and discuss whether or not the program is appropriate for you. Aboard the Aegean Odyssey there is internet service on Belvedere Deck and Wifi is available in designated areas (charges may apply). In this region, at this time of year, average daily temperatures tend to range from the low 50s to the low 80s (F). Complete pre-departure details, such as what to pack and more of what to expect, will be sent to participants.

As a result, Sponsor is not liable for any negligent or willful act or failure to act of any such person or of any other third party.
