







Clarke, Thurston. *Pearl Harbor Ghosts, The Legacy of December 7, 1941*.

Ballantine Books, 2001. A well-researched and evocative look at the bombing of Pearl Harbor by a veteran travel writer. Clarke compares and contrasts the social life and culture of Hawaii on the day of the bombing and sixty years later, enumerating the changes wrought by WWII. 
Laudan, Rachel. *The Food of Paradise, Exploring Hawaii's Culinary Heritage*. Univ. Hawaii Press, 1996. Laudan takes readers on a thoughtful, wide-ranging tour of Hawaii's farms and gardens, fish auctions and vegetable markets, fairs and carnivals, mom-and-pop stores and lunch wagons to uncover the delightful complexities and incongruities in Hawaii's culinary history. With 150 recipes. (PAPER, 304 Pp., \$31.99, **Item HWI257**)



Moore, Susanna. *Paradise of the Pacific, Approaching Hawaii*. Farrar, Straus & Giroux, 2015. An enjoyable history of late 18th-century Hawaii by an award-winning novelist. Moore confines her focus to the islands' not-so-distant collision with the West, conjuring important figures from the period, including shipwrecked sailors, Spanish galleons, British navigators and Irish poachers. Siler, Julia Flynn. *Lost Kingdom*. Atlantic Monthly Press, 2013. Royalty and rogues, sugar barons, politicians and missionaries all figure in Siler's riveting tale of Liliuokalani, the last queen of Hawaii. (PAPER, 480 Pp., \$16.00, **Item HWI254**)




Allen, Helena G. *The Betrayal of Liliuokalani: The Last Queen of Hawaii* 1838-1917. Mutual, 1982. Depicting Hawaii at the moment its monarchy was toppled by missionaries and foreign encroachment, this biography captures the unique and inspirational character of Hawaii's last queen at the end of an era. Brennert, Alan. *Moloka'i*. St. Martin's Press, 2004. Set in Hawaii more than a century ago, Brennert's richly imagined novel of seven-year-old Rachel Kalama -- full of tales of stories of old Hawaii -- draws on historical accounts of Kalaupapa, the isolated leper colony on the island of Moloka'I. 

This all-around field guide features color illustrations of commonly encountered birds, mammals, reptiles, amphibians and fish with notes on Hawaii's geology and popular parks and reserves. Fisher, Richard. *Volcanoes, Crucibles of Change*. Princeton University Press, 1998. A complete primer for the volcano lover, this heavily illustrated book covers types of volcanoes and eruptions, worldwide distribution and the physics of their formation.
