Updates on COVID-19

Carleton's COVID-19 Core Team recently <u>shared</u> some changes to our planned testing and masking policies as we approach the fall term with cases of the Delta variant rising. We remain committed to living, learning, and working together on campus, as laid out in <u>Carleton's</u> <u>plan for the academic year 2021-22</u>.

Whenever possible, students should be tested for COVID-19 72 hours before arriving on campus. Some students and families may not be able to achieve this based on existing travel plans or testing capabilities in their area. In this case, they should plan to test in a timeframe that makes the most sense for their individual situation, with results received before arriving on campus. A PCR or antigen test is acceptable for this pre-arrival testing.

Ultimately, the College's expectation is that students and families will make every effort to ensure they are not bringing the virus to campus. Students are not required to submit proof of a negative test to Carleton; however, if a student receives a positive test result, they will need to <u>report it to the College</u> and delay their arrival until they have recovered. More details about mandatory baseline testing for students upon arrival to campus will be coming soon.


Thank you for joining us!

In Fall 2021, Carleton will host <u>"Why Treaties Matter: Self-Government in the Dakota and Ojibwe Nations."</u> The exhibit, made in partnership between the <u>Minnesota Humanities</u> <u>Center</u>, the <u>Minnesota Indian Affairs Council</u>, and the <u>Smithsonian's National Museum of the American Indian</u>, explores relationships between Dakota and Ojibwe Indian Nations and the U.S. government in this place we now call



Minnesota. Through images, text, and video, learn how treaties affected the lands and lifeways of the indigenous peoples of this place, and why these binding agreements between nations still matter today.
