remain committed to living, learning, and working together on campus, as laid out in Carleton's

Whenever possible, students should be tested for COVID-19 72 hours before arriving on campus. Some students and families may not be able to achieve this based on existing travel plans or testing capabilities in their area. In this case, they should plan to test in a timeframe that makes the most sense for their individual situation, with results received before arriving on campus. A PCR or antigen test is acceptable for this pre-arrival testing.

Ultimately, the College's expectation is that students and families will make every effort to ensure they are not bringing the virus to campus. Students are not required to submit proof of a negative test to Carleton; however, if a student receives a positive test result, they will need to report it to the College and delay their arrival until they have recovered. More details about mandatory baseline testing for students upon arrival to campus will be coming soon.


So far, we have held 15 events this summer, both in-person and virtually, to welcome the




