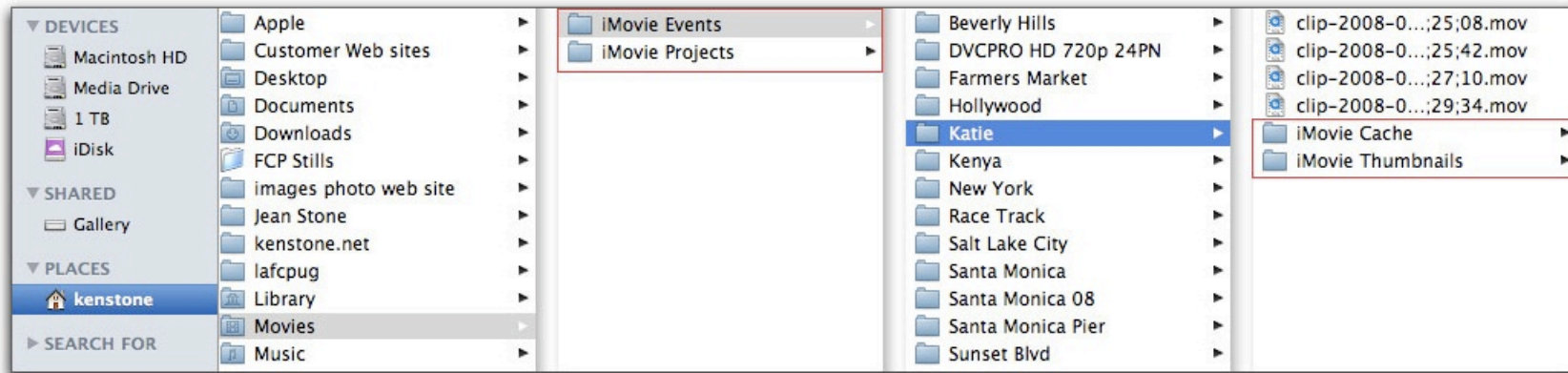
Make sure these two items are checked in general preferences.



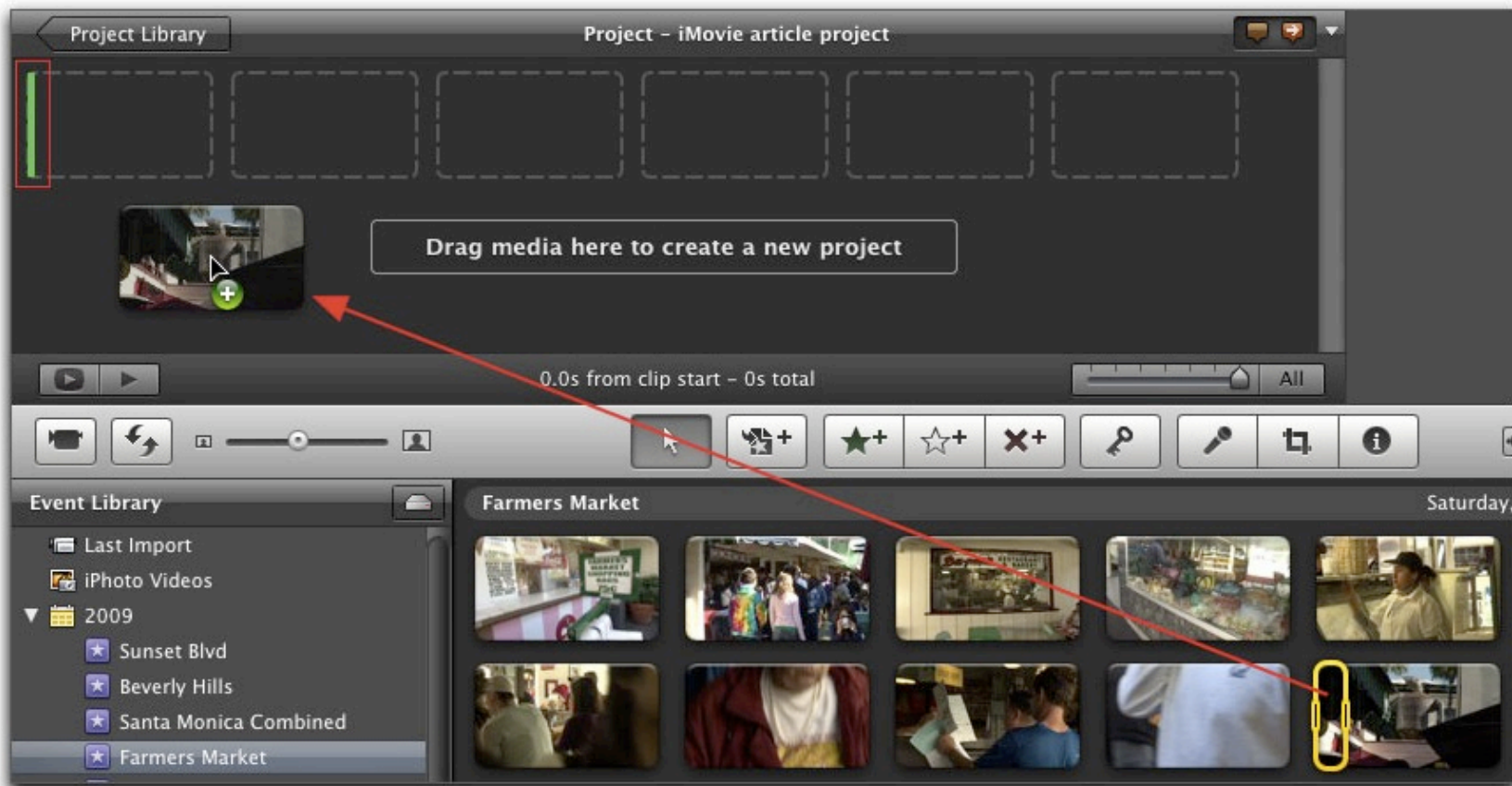
When you start your project, make sure to choose “Standard” or “Widescreen” and not “iPhone.”



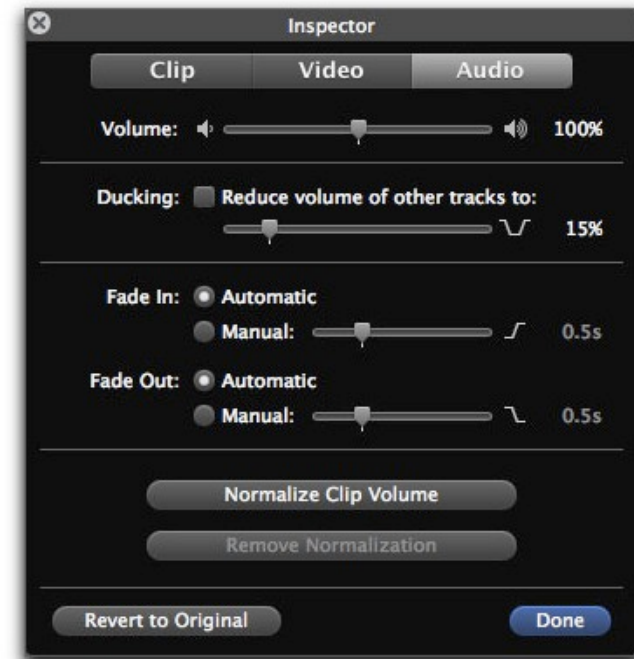
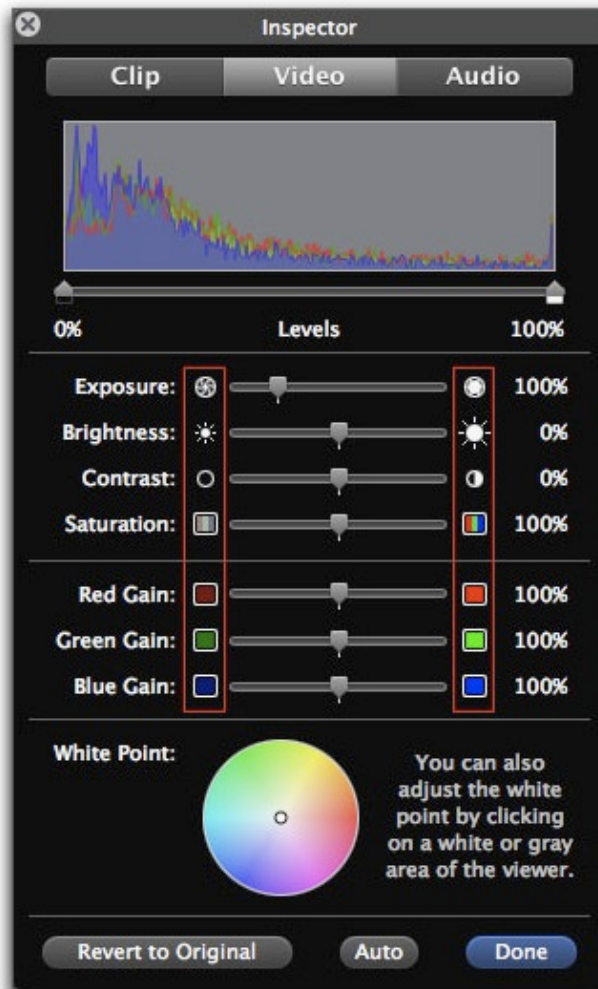
When you import movies from the computer or from a hard drive, you get the choice of where to save them and whether to copy or move them. I recommend copying them.



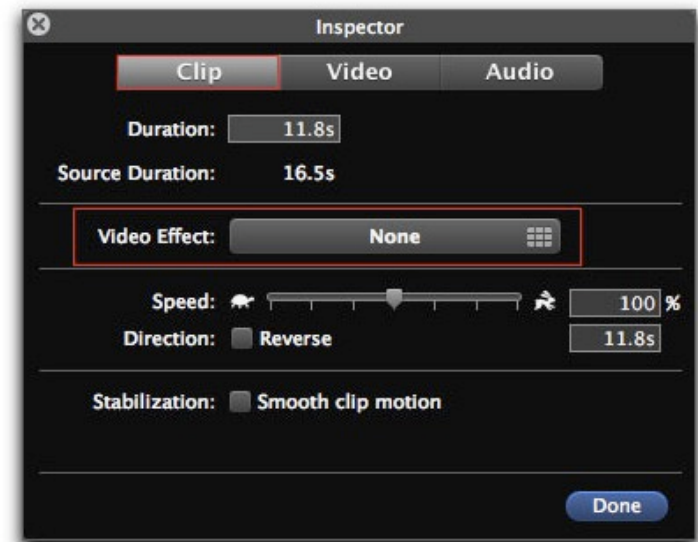
iMovie keeps your files in both an iMovie Events folder and an iMovie Projects folder. Naming your project correctly and keeping track of your files will be essential to working with iMovie.



To make an edit, you select a portion of a source clip and drag it into the project window



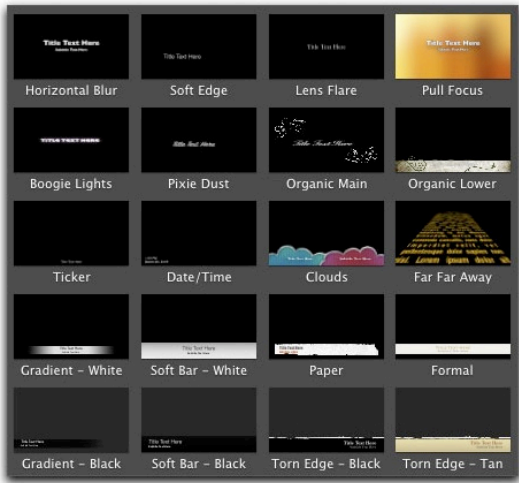
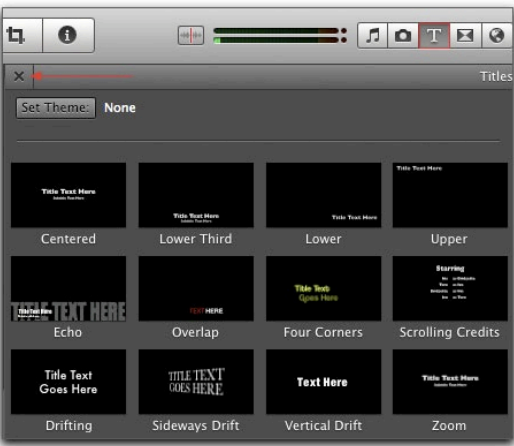
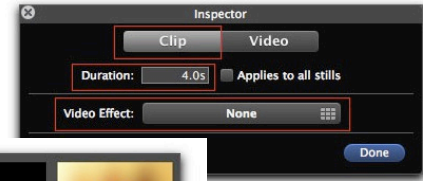
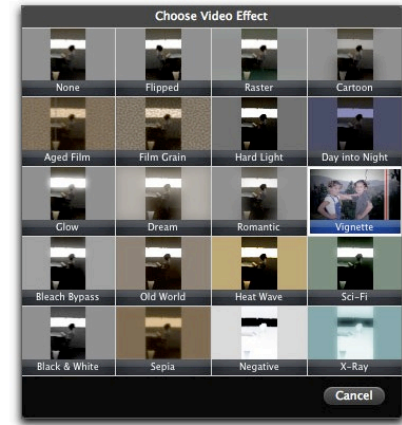
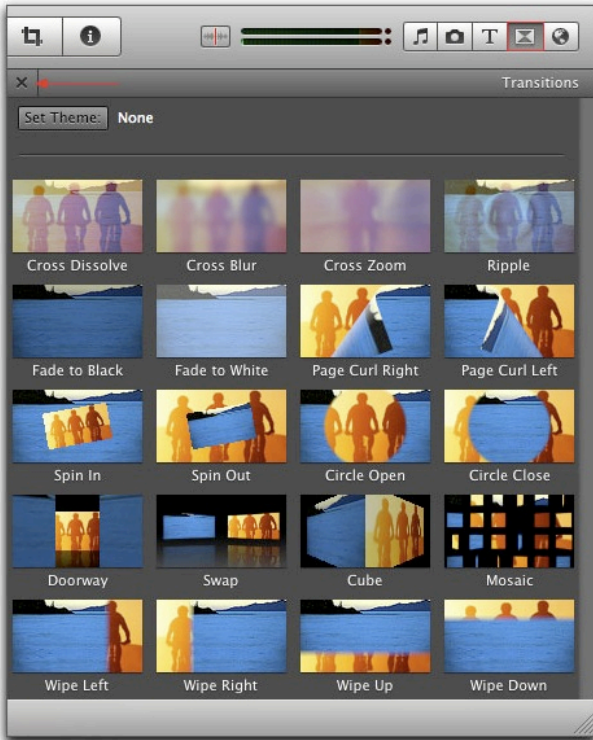
Double-clicking a source clip opens an inspector window.



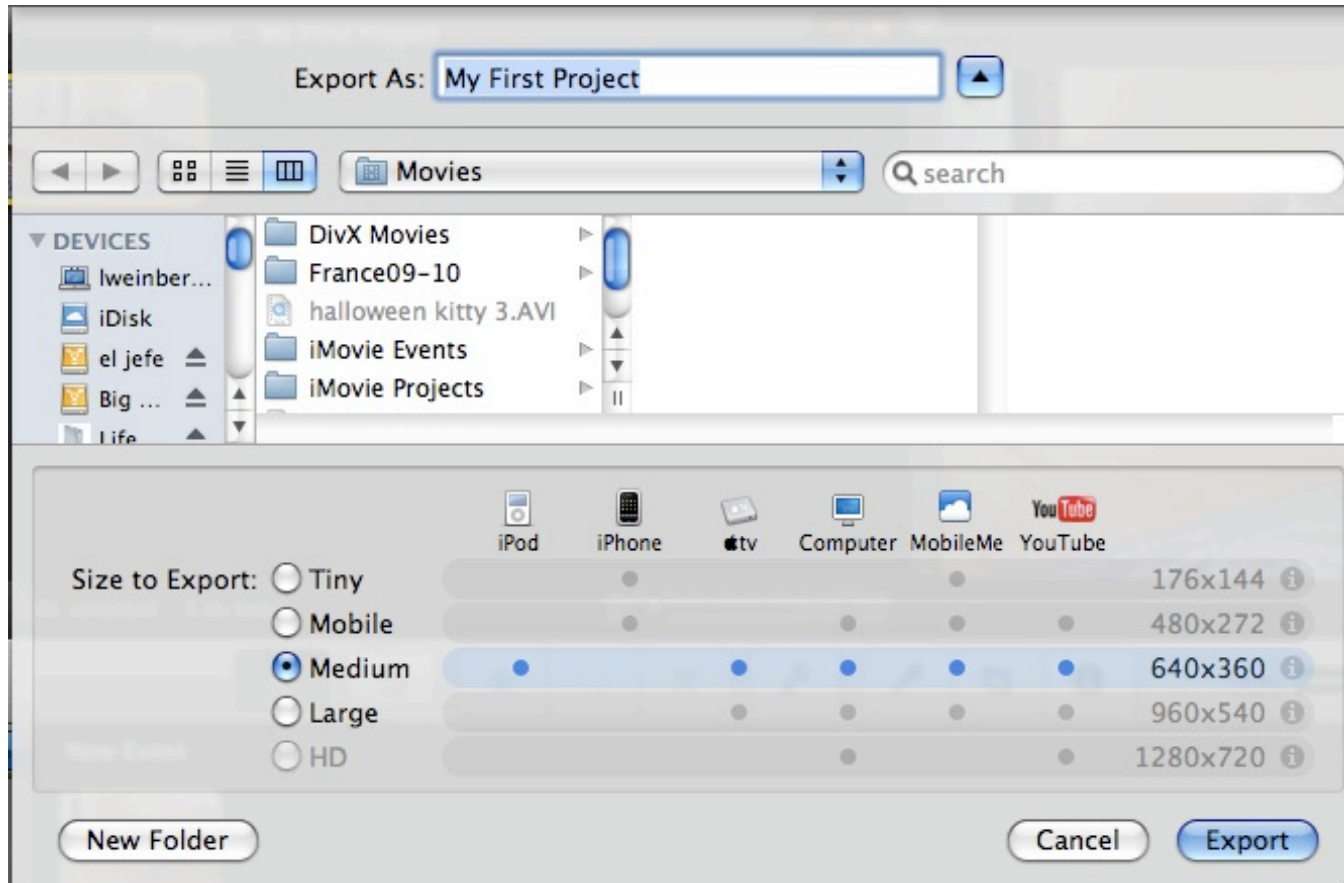


You can create L-cuts for audio in the precision editor.





As in previous versions of iMovie, there are filters, transitions, titles and the Ken Burns effect for still images.



To create a finished movie, you will go to the menu item "Share."  
The medium setting is probably the best for our purposes.
